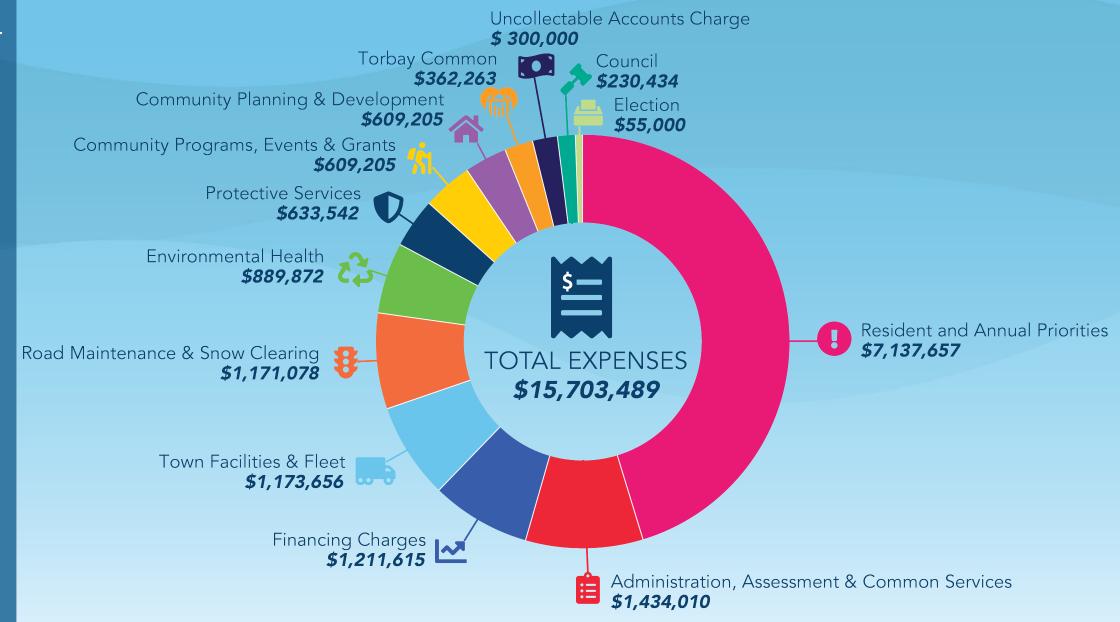

- No mil rate increase in recognition of financial hardship
- COVID Safe Restart funding included at \$464,179
- Recreation events and programs budget reduced 50%
- Summer camp capped at 30 participants, running for 7 weeks
- \$15,000 contingency budgeted
